

***** MINUTES FROM OCTOBER MEETING *****

The October meeting was called to order at 7:03 P.M. by Treasurer Ed Hayek. There were 48 members present for the meeting. Minutes from the September meeting were approved as printed in the September newsletter. The treasurer's report was also approved as printed in the newsletter.

General topics of discussion included an inquiry of how many people were present because of the ads advertising the clubs meeting. It was found that only one person had responded. Ed Hayek informed the club that Home Computer magazine was increasing their prices to \$3.50. Our club price is at \$2.50 and there were 6 copies still available.

Discussion of old business concerned establishing a book library where members could borrow books and literature from each other. Jim Trainor suggested

that the club distribute a list containing the names of members and the material they would be willing to loan out. A vote was taken to have Jim Trainor keep track of the material and to have the club distribute the listing. The motion was approved and seconded.

Additionally, Dave Rynhart proposed that members be allowed to sign out any table literature over 30-days old. A vote was taken and approved to allow an honor sign out and allow members to take this literature home for one month.

The last item of old business concerned interest in members taking an Extended Basic class. A count of hands indicated that 11 members were interested in taking the course. The cost to take this class has not yet been determined and will be dependent on the number of participants.

Discussion of new business centered around next month's renewal of membership. It was announced that a questionnaire will accompany the newsletter. This questionnaire will help provide your officers with information about the kind of equipment and level of knowledge that our members have. This will hopefully provide insight as to what kind of programs to provide in the forthcoming year. In order to encourage a large turnout, the door prize to be given away will be a cartridge expander which retails at \$39.95. Advertisements for next month's meeting will be for members and non-members.

Chuck Moats provided some club trivia. Our total membership stands at 152 members, 82 of whom live in Cedar Rapids, 25 in Marion, 6 in Hiawatha, and the balance in surrounding areas. (Note: 3 members live outside of the state: 1 in Florida, 1 in Kansas, and 1 in Illinois. Ed.)

We were given an excellent demonstration on the speech synthesizer by Dave Dalton. The demonstration was well presented and gave all of the members an idea of what the TI computer could do with speech.

The door prize was won by John Johnson. The prize given away was a Cosmic Math command module. The meeting was adjourned at 8:12 P.M.

***** PROGRAMMING HINTS *****

In the August newsletter I wrote on how to disable the "QUIT" function on the TI. Of course, there is a way you can enable it again. All you need to do is change the last digit in the CALL LOAD statement to a "O" instead of "16". The new statement should look like this: CALL INIT:: CALL LOAD(-31806.0)

I forgot to mention that you should have memory expansion in order to do this. Here are some more CALL LOADS that may be helpful. (Use with memory expansion only!)

HINT: Always use the CALL INIT statement prior to the CALL LOAD statement that you wish to use!!

CALL PEEK(2,A,B) :: CALL LDAD(-31804,A,B)
(This brings up the title screen)

CALL LOAD(-31962,255)
(This is the power-up execution program in which the computer looks for a program called LOAD)

CALL LOAD(-31878, X)
(Moves sprites faster. X= number of moving sprites)

CALL LOAD(-31878,0)
(Makes program run faster. No sprites!)

CALL LOAD(31748,X)
(Changes speed of cursor flash and also shuts off
the sound processor. X= speed of cursor. 0= not
flashing (use only in programs). 1= normal, 255=
fastest)

CALL LOAD(32700,0)
(Stops program without ready prompt)

Here are some more helpful hints that may help you beginners:

- If errors are detected in a program you have typed, check for interchanged "O" (zero) and "O" (the letter O).
- If you have your TV and cassette recorder mounted on a metal table, and you are having trouble with inputting data (outputting, too), try raising the cassette recorder off the table about 4°. Use a book or special stand.
- To present a scene all at once, rather than the viewer having to watch it being made, use a CALL SCREEN (2) to black out everything until the graphics are ready.
- 4. When using Extended Basic, and you want to get movement slower that the CALL MOTION (1) will allow, try using CALL LOCATE statements and a loop. For example:

100 CALL CLEAR :: FOR X=10 TO 190 :: FOR I=1 TO 100 :: NEXT I :: CALL SPRITE(#1, 65,2,X,X) :: NEXT X

The "FOR I=1 TO 100" statement determines how fast the sprite will move. Sprite's use dot row and column and move in smaller increments than CALL HCHAR.
