THE LIST by Bill Paeth

Have you ever wanted to pair up a list of items with a group of people? Additionally you would want to periodically change the item each person has and also would want to ensure that any one person does not get the same thing more then once in a cycle. One additional restriction would be that it must be a totally random rotation.

My family has been doing this since sometime in the 1970's. We called it the Christmas Draw. In the begining it literally was a draw in that we put all the family names in a hat and let everyone draw one out. Many restrictions had to be placed on this event. Like "not your name" and "not last year's name" etc. What this really caused was a lot of name trading through out the years.

We finally found that a good mix would be generated by listing the family members on a sheet of paper along with their current drawn name. The same list could then be used after shifting the names by one space each time and matching the names across the matrix.

In 1993 a new list had to be generated because of two drops and one new addition. After a lively discussion at the dinner table the following rules were established:

- 1. No one could have their own name.
- 2. Everyone would have each of the other members by the end of one cycle.
- 3. It would be totally random.

Shortly there after we three retired to my computer room and proceeded to rough out the following program. I sat at my TI 99/4A with "EXTENDED BASIC". My son Pete loaded IBM "QBASIC". And Scott sat between us writing the program in "APPLE BASIC" in his head because his Apple 2e was in Des Moines. We actually got both the TI 99 and the IBM programs to do what we wanted. At this time we only have Scott's word that it should work on the Apple. All numbers are written to each loop randomly so the next to the last loop can take quite a long time. By the way I am number 9 on THE LIST.
