NEW BOOK FILE

BASIC FUN - Computer Games, Puzzles and Problems Children Can Write

BASIC FUN is a good Basic programming guide for young people to acquire the skills in Basic programming. The authors have a unique combination of skills that contribute to the learning exercises in this book. Chapters cover puzzles, games and problems using Basic language, i.e., goto, functions, print, strings, input, subscripts and subroutines. BASIC FUN starts with the super simple and goes into more complex programming as the child progresses through the chapters. Also included are special notations for any changes required for programs to run in TI Basic. I bought mine at Young Ideas Children's Book Store, Plymouth Park, Irving, Tx. Also suitable for Adults.
