"FOR-THE-BIRDS" (see above graphic)

Life has not been the same since a gift *L. L. Bean* bird feeder arrived over a year ago. Our back yard and patio deck have turned into a wild life refuge (*we could qualify for federal funds*) as we added some more hanging and ground feeding stations. Black sunflower seed and cracked corn are year-round favorites (suet hung in winter for the fat eaters) and a bird bath provides drink as well as a place to bathe and frolic. Discarded seed shells and the droppings are easily dispatched by broom and garden hose. Lawn, bushes and trees are hardly trimmed (enough to meet weed control laws) to ensure a suitable habitat. Critters (cats, squirrels, etc.) are a nuisance, but tolerable. *House finches* are our birds-in-residence, and *Juncos* winter with us November through April. *Bluejays, grackles, and mourning doves* abound in profusion. Of course there are the ubiquitous *chickadees, titnice, and nut hatches*, with an occasional visit by *cardinals, wrens (above) flickers and woodpeckers*. Except for bird bathing, the *robins* shun us and dig worms on our lawn. Little wonder, I'm seeking clip-art graphics of our feathered friends.

TEXAS INSTRUMENTS STILL CARES!

Texas Instruments still provides a great service to the TI-99/4A user, by providing repair service, for our computers. I called Texas Instruments at 1-800-TI-CARES (1-800-842-2737) and asked about their repair service. I was told that they still repair all the equipment manufactured by them for fixed prices and if it could not be fixed, they would replace it with on hand stock. The following is the prices, that I received today, March 12, 1991, to repair the equipment. They will also repair CC-40 equipment at the following rates:

Editor's Note: Commenting on the above article in the July/Aug 1991 issue of A BYTE OF INFO, Tom Bousson of Reading-Berks 99'ers, noted "This apparently also applies to older TI calculators. I recently had some of the keys on my TI-59 get erratic. On a lark, I called TI-CARES and discovered that they would repair the old card programmable for a flat rate of \$75. That seems to be a bit steep, but if you want to keep getting use from a calculator, you might consider spending that much money. TI does not manufacture a comparable calculator at present."

Your NUTS NEWS editor would add, that unless you insist that your hardware be in like-new, factory-specs condition, most of us would be better advised to replace rather than repair with items from yard sales, etc.. Here in the Centre Region, you can pick up a console for \$5 and a PEB (loaded with cards), often under \$50. It was not mentioned before, but a 90-day warranty comes with the repairs by TI.
