MYARC 1024K RAM BOARD?

Or Sometimes A Little Knowledge Can Be A Dangerous Thing Department.

(About 6 months ago I ran this article and todate have had no one offer a solution to my situation. I thought I'd try once more. I wish Myarc would have enough interest to make an E-prom that would handle it!)

Smart me I got 16 QUAD RAM chips (TI's TMS4464 or equal) and replaced my 4 chips in the Myarc 128K Memory Expansion Card (MEXP-1). Powered it up and tried to partition it as a ram disk and could only get a syntax error message no matter how I divided it! Then I remembered that the Myarc disk manager program had a ram disk utility. So I loaded it (the 48K section was happy) and proceeded to the utility section. When the ram disk available memory was displayed it said "1024K AVAILABLE"! NOT 512K! Suprise! Suprise! However, the program went bonkers when IT tried

to partition that much memory. The EPROM can only count to 512K, I assume, therefore can not label the additional 512K! Well, I've put my original 128K back in but if anyone knows if there is an EPROM available to handle the 1024K I'd sure like to get one. (I hate to throw away the Quad Ram chips considering how hard they were to find!)

The solution may not be that simple but then again it may. I called Myarc and inquired but got no direct reply. Lou Phillips certainly has his hands full with other more pressing matters so may not get back to me. Anyone have any suggestions?

"COMMUNICATING WITH A DOT MATRIX PRINTER"

Adapted for the TI99/4A computer to TI BASIC, and the LX800 Epson printer from a program written in BASIC by Randall Staponski, of Tulsa, Okla. published in the June 1985 issue of the COMPUTER SHOPPER. By Leslie M. Lowery Sr, Lake Charles, La.,

One of the shortcomings in listing BASIC programs on today's crop of computers, printers and software is the lack of format control. When debugging a program, most people like to double space the listing, (sometime triple space if there a lot of additions to be made).

After the program is complete, then a single spaced near letter quality

copy is handy for one's file. Unfortunately the List command on

most BASIC Interpreters, makes no allowance for printing options.

A second shortconing is printing return address mailing labels.

The purpose here is twofold:(1) explain in simple terms the method used to communicate by software with dot matrix printers and (2) include a BASIC program which, although simple. will simplify some of the features

of printing on your dot matrix printer. The program that will be discussed is written for the Epson line of printers. However, with some research, it can be modified to work with other types of dot matrix printers.

All of the dot matrix printers currently available allow several different printing styles,. On the Epson MX and FX series these include Normal, Double Strike, Double Width, Italics and Emphasized just to

name a few. After determining a printer can do a lot of fancy tricks the next step is to find out how to communicate with it.

The instruction manual which comes with an Epson printer is easy to read but quite thick and contains too much material to memorize at a sitting.

The secret of communicating with the Epson, is a control code which must be sent from the computer to the printer.

Receipt of this code tells the printer to accept what follows as

an instruction or control code, but however, the printer does not print it. The manual suggests that the User should memorize each control code. For the average person, committing some 60 odd codes to memory is not a valid option.

The code for getting the printer's attention is the ASCII code for the escape key, which can be sent to the printer using the basic function CHR\$(x). This function converts x to its single character ASCII equivalent (x must be an integer between Ø and 255. A look at an ASCII table shows the decimal value for the letter "A" to be 65. Therefore, CHR\$(65)="A". The same table shows the decimal value for the excape key is 27. The following Basic statement will get the printer's attention:

10 PRINT #1:CHR\$(27)

The control code for Double Strike printing is "G" whose ASCII value is 71. The complete Basic statement for Double Strike printing becomes:

1Ø PRINT #1:CHR\$(27);CHR\$71)

Other control codes are used to put the printer in other print modes.

The Basic code shown above will only work with Epson printers and lookalikes, Although the control codes are different, the same principles may be used to communicate with other printers such as the Okidata. Much more complex commercial software, such as word processors, use the same principles discussed above to print documents. Since the control codes used by the major printer manufacturers are not standardized, most installation procedures ask the user to specify the type of printer that will be used. By installing the control codes for several popular printers, one version of software can utilize the full capabilities of different printers with incompatible control schemes.

Next month we'll look at a Basic program listing that combines several control codes into a menu driven program. The program is written in North Star Basic and is used on a North Star Advantage. However, it should run on most dialects of BASIC with little or no changes. The objective of the program is to easily put the printer in the desired mode (double strike, italics, etc.). This allows the user to execute a second program which sends output to the printer. The second program could be a list program or another BASIC program. After execution is complete the print mode program can be run again to return the printer to the desired mode.

HOW TO USE THE NEW BOOLG LIBRARY CATALOG

As this is the first Library Catalog issued by the R99NG using the new catalog format, a few notes of explanation are considered to be in order.

You will notice that there are headings across the top of every catalog page. these headings give as much information about the program as I can put in a brief catalog listing.

The Headings, and their Explanations are as follows:

Program #: This is the reference number of the program in the library.

Disk #: This is the number of the disk the program is on.

Prog. Cat.: This is the category of the program. (Ex.:MUS = MUSIC)

Program Title: This is the full Name of the program.

Name: This is the "Diskname" true should use for your files on disk.

Language: This is the language the program is written in.

Size: This column gives the number of sectors needed for the Diskfile.

Old #: This cross-references the new listing with the old catalog #.

The second line of each listing is used to note what equipment or software is essential for running the program. I did not include the console in these notes as you must have a console to run any of these programs.

The following are some of the abbreviations used in the 2nd line:

Disk: Requires Disk Memory System.

Cassette: Requires Cassette Recorder.

E/A-M/M: Requires Editor/Assembler or Mini-Memory Cartridge

32K: Requires 32K Memory Expansion

RS232: Requires RS232 Device and Expansion System.

L000: Requires L000 Cartridge.

TEII: Requires Terminal Emulator II Cartridge.

Speech: Requires Speech Synthesizer.

The third line of each listing is a brief description of the program.

Under the column headed "Language", you will find many abbreviations so I am listing the most common ones here to avoid confusion.

CB: Console Basic.

XB: Extended Basic.

E/A: Assembly Language.

Forth: T.I. Forth.

C99: Small c written by Clint Pulley.

L0G0: T.I. Logo.

Pilot: Pilot Programming Language.

W/Forth: Wycove Forth.

Pascal: UCSD Pascal for the T.I. (Req. P-Code Card).

Other abbreviations you will find are TI/W for T.I. Writer, M/P for Microsoft Multiplan, and F/W for FunlWriter (FunlWeb).

Your should give the "Program #:", "Disk #:", and "Program Category" for each program you order. Programs with a "Letter" ending such as 1001/A indicate that the program is part of a connected series of programs that should all be ordered together for correct operation.
