FROM MY VIEWPOINT.

I have been getting on Genie, the national bulletin board, for about three years. There always was exciting new software and big announcements to be found there. I estimate there were 40-50 new pieces of software a month. I have been on the Genie about three times in the last month and counted roughly 10 pieces of software and most of them were for the 9640. Our best writers of software seem to have transferred over to the "compatible" Myarc 9640. By spliting our ranks with two computers to program for, we have lost some of the best programmers to the 9640. Another effect of the 9640, has been the delay of releasing software so it could be tested and made compatible or a different version made to run on the 9640. Unfortunately we have not really increased our ranks of users by the release of the 9640. We now find there are two sides of the street to satisfy in our TI community. We really seem to end up being the losers by the addition of the 9640. I had one, tried it, found that my family members refused to use it and wanted the old TI99/4a back. So I sold it. I haven't missed it. I do miss the input of our programmers that are caught up in the 9640 world and now divide their time between their two machines. I do wish to thank all of the programmers that have contributed to the TI99/4a for making it an exciting and viable machine in the home computer market. Long after it's demise(!) or halting manufacturing, we have a good, useful, flexible, inexpensive home system to rely on. This responsibility for success is shared by the contributors of our software and our hardware. If you are considering leaving the TI99/4a to go to another machine, consider the investment in time you have made learning the TI invironment, and the considerable expense in software and hardware you have already made. Ask yourself "Does the TI do what I need?" If it

still does, then you really don't need to change.

To sum up this editorial, We have split our ranks, lost some of our great contributors but still have a good viable home computer to rely on.

### NEW EQUIPMENT!



## HARDWARE PROJECT

BUILD YOUR OWN JOYSTICK ADAPTER

THIS IS THE SCHEMATIC TO BUILD YOUR OWN JOYSTICK ADAPTER TO USE THE ATARI/COMMODORE COMPATIBLE JOYSTICKS. THE NUMBERS GO WITH THE PINS OF THE CONSOLE PORT AND THE JOYSTICK CONNECTORS. THE 30 SYMBOL REPRESENTS A 1NT14 DIODE (OR EQUIVALENT) MHICH CAM SE FOUND AT ANY RADIO SHACK, SE SURE TO INSTALL THE DIODES WITH THE SANDED END TO THE JOYSTICK SIDE.

THE BOX MENTIONED IN THE PARTS LIST REFERS TO ONE OF THOSE LITTLE . PLASIC BOXES YOU GET AT RADIO SHACK, IN THE DRAWING BELOW, AN "S" DENOTES A CONNECTION, OTHERWISE NO MIRES SHOULD TOUCH.
