* NEW EXPANSION BOX FOR THE TI *

It has come to our attention that a California company called Core Comp Inc. is in process of manufacturing a new peripheral expansion box for the 99/4A. The box is to include a 32k memory expansion card, an RS-232 card, and a double sided double density disk controller card. The cards will be selling (suggested prices) for 119.95, 79.95 and 119.95 respectively. The peripheral expansion box, with the above mentioned cards plus disk drive connection and power supply, may sell for approximately 249.00.

Also, if anyone out there remembers rumors from not long ago, TI was attempting to come out with a new 99/8 prior to the breakup. Well, we also understand that Core Comp Inc. may come out with a replacement with much more to offer. Such as, an RS-232, disk manager, 10 octaves of sound capable of generating 3 to 5 voices, extended basic, speech capabilities, 65k of RAM that can be expanded up to 512k, and possibly up to four different types of keyboards. The computer will provide two cartridge ports and may use the 6502 or ZX-80 processor's. What's the name of it you ask? The PHOENIX!, and should become available during March, 1984. * SPRITE PROGRAM *

From the Rocky Mountain newsletter TIC TALK comes a neat little program you can use to confuse and frustrate any friends who own Atari, VIC-20, or TRS-80 units. Just type in the following program in the Command Mode with EXTENDED BASIC:

CALL CLEAR :: CALL SCREEN(5) :: CALL MAGNIFY(2) :: FOR I=1 TO 28 :: CALL SPRITE(#I,64+I,16,80,80,3*I,8) :: NEXT I :: FOR J=1 TO 5000 :: NEXT J

Hit ENTER and watch all 28 sprites do their tricks. It you want to see them again, press FCTN REDO and then ENTER. You can insert, delete, or whatever, to try different speeds, colors, characters, or even add a line number to make it a simple one-line program.
