

If you are interested in starting a PIC account, fill out the application, read and sign the agreement outlining the terms and conditions, and send both back to the library. You do not need to send money now, you will be billed on the first of the next month after you return the Application for Service. (Invoicing will be done through the City Treasurer's office.)

Your account, however, will be set up and ready for use within a few days after we receive your Application for Service. When your account is set up, you will receive a copy of the Application for Service and an informational packet describing how to log into your account, basic Internet services, materials at the library to help use the Internet, and other information you will need to know to make full use of your account.

Presently your PIC account will include electronic mail, telnet, file transfer protocol, and two additional "tools" for navigating the Internet known as Gopher and LIBS. Additional offerings are in the planning stages and will be announced to PIC account holders as they are ready.

Thank you for your interest in this new and innovative service. We are excited about offering it and hope to hear from you soon.


