# SOFTWARE REVIEW - DISK+AID

Several months ago CHUG was contacted by Donald M. Thomson III of M & T UTILITYWARE with an offer of the opportunity to demonstrate his software products. I now consider DISK+AID the most useful utility that I own for my TI. DISK+AID is a single sectoring utility with over 28 menu driven operations most of which are selectable by I keystroke. Here is a sample of the commands available from the menu:

- A> ALTER MODE Change any byte being displayed by use of full a screen editor
- C> VIEW CPU MEMORY Displays memory contents on screen
- D> DUMP Dumps screen to output device
- E> COMPARE SECTORS
- M> MOVE SECTOR
- P> PRINT SECTORS Prints selected sectors to output device

The functions that this utility performs are too numerous to list. This is just enough to give some idea of the versatility of the software.

Why are these functions valuable? If you damage the directory on a disk containing files obtained through hours of work at the keyboard, you'll soon see the value. I damaged 3 disks worth of assembly source code that I did not back up. Without this program the only option available was to re-enter all of the data again. This is not a very pleasant experience. The manuals that Don supplies with his product contain the information necessary to re-build the disk directory. It also supplies some insight in the TI DOS. The manual is very well written and is nicely packaged.

DISK+AID can be purchased with or without source code. Yes, it is 100% 9900 assembly language and requires EDITOR/ASSEMBLER, MINI-MEMORY, OR EXTENDED BASIC. Since

DISK+AID uses these modules as a loader only, the program will run using option 2 of the files utility of the CORCOMP disk manager (no module necessary). The software can be ordered from M&T UTILITYWARE, 3507 Murl, Muskegon, MI 49442. The price is \$20 for object code and \$27 for source and object code (quantity discounts are available).

#### COUPON FILER PROGRAM

This program was my first attempt at programming in TI BASIC. It is a translation and modification of a program written for another computer. The idea is the same, but the code has been changed for the TI. It requires nothing more than a console and a tape recorder.
