

THE PREZ SEZ...



Last month we lost one of our founding members, Grant Schmalgemeier, and I lost a good friend. Grant's sudden death caught everyone by surprise because while Grant had long suffered from asthma, he had never let it curtail his activities, nor even slow him down. Grant was so much a part of this organization in

its formative years that when he got sick a few years ago, the whole thing ground to a halt. Only then did everyone begin to realize how many tasks he had accepted and for how much of the behind-the-scenes work he was responsible. In recognition of that, the membership of the Chicago TI99/4A Users Group has decided to rename the annual service award (of which he was a recipient in 1990) the Grant Schmalgemeier Memorial Service Award. I think he would be pleased.

Jim Brooks, our Membership Chairman, has also been under the weather these past few months, and he has sadly informed us that he feels that he should step down from his position. Jim has done a marvelous job for the last few years, and even during his illness he has continued to perform his duties for the CTIUG. His shoes wil be hard to fill, and knowing that, he has agreed to remain on until June, or as soon as a replacement can be found. We will miss Jim, but everyone hopes that he will have a speedy recovery. If anyone is willing to assume the duties of Membership Chairman, they can get in touch with me, and I will do my best to smooth the transition.

Part of the job of being President of the CTIUG is answering letters. Mostly I enjoy answering the correspondence that comes across my desk, but every now and then there is one that is not so pleasant. I received one such letter the other day, and it was annoying. It was from a person who complained that we didn't seem to want him as a member, because we hadn't immediately responded to his request for materials. I attempted to phone this fellow, only to learn from the phone company that no one by that name lived at that address, according to their records. I was disappointed, because I had wanted to tell him personally that we very much want him as a member, but also to let him know that his petulance with the CTIUG was misplaced. From the tone of his letter to me, and the similar tone of the letter to Jim Brooks, he seemed to have acquired the impression that he was dealing with a business or commercial organization with a staff of employees. Nothing, let me assure you, could be further from the truth! We are a group of people who have volunteered our time to serve our fellow Tiers because each of us thinks that what we are doing is helping to keep the TI community alive and vibrant. All of us have jobs families, and other interests and commitments, and none of us make a dime from our work for this Group. While we don't expect effusive thanks, we certainly don't need abuse and profanity, either. I realize that it must be frustrating to wait for items or information from an organization, but owing to the way that our incoming requests are distributed, it is often a month, or longer, before those requests reach the right person, and even then there may be difficulties in fulfilling those requests. I would ask anyone who has a problem to be patient. We are doing our best, under sometimes trying circumstances, to serve all our members. This is neither a giant business, nor the Army; we work through the spirit of mutual cooperation. I would also like to remind everyone that the members of the executive board have published their addresses and phone numbers. Communicating with the proper person directly speeds response time quite a bit.

Last month we announced that the CTIUG BBS would be installing Caller ID, the new program from the phone company that would have allowed the Sysop of our BBS to instantly validate new callers, and would also have allowed normal users to do away with the logon procedure. I say would have, because after a trial of the system, our Sysop, Mike Maksimik, discovered that less than 40 percent of the Chicago area was covered by the plan, and it will be years until the coverage even in this area is complete. The expense of the feature was deemed to be too great for the limited amount of use we could have gotten, and we have decided to cancel Caller ID until there is wider implementation.

One of our members, Tom Clayton, asked a question about the availability of a comprehensive list of hard and software for the TI99/4A at a recent meeting, and in true CTIUG tradition, he found himself as chairman of a committee to research the subject. If you have information to share with Tom, or if you would like to be on the committee, get in touch with him. It is an important project, and the results will benefit us all.

Plans for our future events, such as the Annual Picnic and the Chicago TI International World Faire are progressing more or less smoothly. There have been some delays in getting some letters out, due to certain suicidal tendencies on the part of my system (my computer system, that is!), but the technogurus of this group keep resuscitating it, and I will eventually get everything done.

Lastly, there is some good and bad news to report: at the end of the last meeting we gave away five door prizes to ten winners. Five of the winners had already left before their names were drawn by Bob Demeter's little daughter. I would urge everyone to stick around for the door prize drawing

and the various SIGs that we are trying to get going again. Without a roomful of people it isn't as much fun to do a cemo. And if you do decide to stay, please try to wait until the demonstrations are finished before you begin to carry on conversations with the vendors seated around the room. It is difficult to hear the speakers if there are a number of conversations going on. Even if you already know what the speaker is going to say, chances are those around you don't.

By the time you read this, I hope you are all recovered from St. Paddy's Day! See you at the meeting.

Monthly Minutes

The Executive Board Meeting of March 7, 1992 was brought to order at 11:00 A.M.

ATTENDING - A printed agenda was passed cut to the attending members, consisting of Hal Shanafield, Irv

Levinson, Jim Deerds, Vic Steerup, and Orland Degris.

MINUTES - The Minutes of the February meeting were published in the Newsletter, and, with a minor addition, approved. The addition being: In the LIBRARY section, under A)REVIEWS, up to five free disks are available to each member under the condition that 1) The disks are cataloged, the programs run and descriptions of the files are sent to the Librarian for inclusion in the new Library Catalog, and 2) Written reviews are sent in to the newsletter for publication. A Motion to accept the amended Minutes was made by Jim, seconded by Hal, and approved by the Board.

TREASURERS REPORT - (Irv Levinson) The current bank balance is generous, with all outstanding bills paid. Last months' income reflected membership renewals. The final tally showed that the Faire did generate income. It is nice to know that the Club doesn't subsidize the Faire. A motion to accept the report was made by Vic, seconded by Jim, and approved by the Board.

PRESIDENTS REPORT - (Hal Sharafield)

A)Grant Schmalgemeier - Hs P.O. Box is the one the Club has used since it's beginning. He had been paid for its use. Grant also handled the use of the Postal Meter, its annual inspection, and having it filled. The Meter is used for postage on all of the Newsletters. He also took care of all the extension cords the Vendors used at the Faire, as well as other equipment that was leaned to them

Tony Z. and Dave Connery arrived at 11:40.

B)Jim Brooks - Jim has been ill for some time, and although he has handled his position as Membership Chairman, he would like to step down in June because he cannot attend meetings. The job involves handling all of the membership records, printing up the mailing labels, correspondence with members, mailing out membership cards, working with Newsletter Editor Bob Demeter, and working at the Faire accepting renewals and new membership applications there, as well as through the mail. The records are kept on disk using P.R.Base. Any member who feels he can handle this task, please contact Hal as soon as possible.

C)FAIRE UPDATE - The Prez's system was down for a while, so the letters to our Vendors thanking them for last year, and soliciting their attendance this year, that were delayed will now be sent out.

Don Jones and Mike Maksimik arrived at 11:55.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

EVENTS · Today's demo will be a videotape showing how to make and install guard bars to protect circuit cards that extend from the back of the P-box. This video will also be available from the Library.

MEMBERSHIP - (Jim Brooks) Reported that last month there were no new members, and only two renewals. Be sure to check your Newsletter mailing label for your expiration date! One reason members don't get Newsletters is forgetting to renew.

NEWSLETTER - Don Jones brough: up that it is important for the Club to get back issues out to members who paid for, and are owed them. The Board authorized him to handle the copying of the five issues from 1991 and mailing them out.

LIBRARY - (Dave Connery) At least two members are getting a free package of Library software to review. So can you. (See the Minutes section for rules. v.s.) The Library Software Catalog is being redone, as the original disk was accidently wiped out. When using DM-1000 to make a backup, always put the MASTER in drive ONE and the BACKUP in drive TWO. Dave has a list of Club-owned equipment and will compute the dollar value of it. He also announced that the Library is low on its supply of disks, and asked the Board to authorize the purchase of a large supply of blank disks, so we could get them at a quantity discourt. A motion to authorize this expenditure was made by Irv. seconded by Jim and passed by the Board.

Today's Special: Two for the price of one on any of the numbered Library disks.

BULLETIN BOARD - (Mike Maksimik) Caller ID has been removed from the Bulletin Board, as only about 40% of the Chicago area TRANSMITS it, and it is not sent on calls from outside the BBS' area code. More than 50% of calls received are from outside the 708 and 312 area codes. A Phone Company representative said that Caller ID will not be available in all areas until late 1995, as the equipment would have to be installed in old exchanges, some of which have equipment dating back to 1965. Irv proposed that our use of Caller ID be put on the agenda in 1995. Mike announced that his house, where the BBS is located, would probably be demolished in 5 years to make way for the Calumet City Airport. The BBS will move with him, and probably stay in the west or southwest Chicago area.

PUBLICITY - A set of the EOG's was given away as a door prize at Fest West, creating some publicity and advertising for our group. Vol. 3 is ready for printing, and will have addendums added to it after printing as additional fonts come out. These Manuals will save desktop publishers a tremendous amount of time and wear on their printers, as every known font or graphic is in them, and can easily be looked up. Dave moved that we give a copy of Vol. 3 to Sr. Pat Taylor, BVM, who always gives us publicity on our projects, seconded by Irv, and passed by the Board. Micropendium would also get a copy for review purposes.

OLD BUSINESS - HOT LINE - It was debated if it was worth the expense having the Hot Line, as most calls to it are at Faire time, from people who want information about the Faire, or from Vendors calling to secure a table, rather than writing. The message on the Club-owned answering machine is the location, time, and date of our meetings. Most calls are "hangups", with no message being left.

Don Walden arrived at 12:45

Mike announced the availability of a "voice/data" device that could be installed ir the BES, and would automatically switch a voice call to the answering machine, and a data (modem) call to the BBS. This device would pay for itself in 5 months by not having to have a separate phone line for the Hot Line. A message would be left on the old Hot Line number directing callers to use the BBS number. This is a small charge compared to the cost of a separate phone line. A motion to table the installation of this until more information is available was made by Mike, seconded by Dave, and passed by the Board.

George Lempeotis arrived at 12:45.

DOS LIBRARY - (George Lempeotis) He has a listing available to members of all software available in the DOS Library. He now has a CD-ROM full of assorted software. George has been buying blank disks out-of-pocket, and will be reimbursed for this expense until he breaks even. A motion that the price of DOS software be set by the DOS Librarian, subject to approval by the Board, was made by Jim, seconded by Dave, and passed by the Board.

Shareware: 5.5" disks are \$2.00 ea.

3.5" disks are \$2.50 ea.

The Board Meeting adjourned at 1:00 P.M.

GENERAL MEETING -

The Minutes of the February Board Meeting, that were published in the March Newsletter, were approved by the attending members. The Prez and Treasurers reports were the same as the Board meeting. Hal asked that the currently unnamed award for outstanding service to the Club be named the "Grant Schmalgemeier Memorial Service Award". A motion was made and seconded by several members and approved unanimously.

Jim Bairds announced that he was having a special on GIF disks from the GENEVE Library for \$2.00 ea.

Bob Demeter announced that he inadvertently sent out some Newsletters one day late.

Tony Z. announced that the deadline for the programming contest has been extended to June 30.

Thomas Clayton asked that people who are knowledgeable make a compendium of software utilities, and also hardware that can be used on the TI, with descriptions of what they do and how they work. He was appointed to head a committee to form such a compendium of utilities and hardware. This will be a great help to new or inexperienced users in selecting utilities or hardware that will be most useful to them. Orland Degris demo'ed his videotape on P- ∞ guard bars, which included installation of an auxiliary cooling fan.

Mark Harms demo'ed Graphic Workshop for DOS computers, which loaded in GIFs and allowed modifying them.

Five door prizes were given away at the end of the meeting, which consisted of choice of free software from any of the Libraries, disk boxes, ca\$h donated by Tony Z. from the sales of his DEMO program disk, and a monitor. Some prizes were given to an alternate winners, as the first names drawn had already left.
