

Corrections to Programming Aids III Editor

If you have a copy of the Editor program from Programming Aids III you will have found that it probably does not resequence line numbers correctly. This can be corrected by changing line 6220 GOTO 6250 to read 5220 GOTO 6260. The Editor program cannot process programs that contain more than four hundred lines. It cannot resequence more than 200 lines per run.

If you use the Output option of the TE2 to save data to either disk or cassette, you can use the following Extended Basic program to retrieve the data.

- 100 INPUT "device and file name":FILE\$
- 110 OPEN #1:FILE\$, INPUT, DISPLAY, FIXED 80
- 120 LINPUT #1:A\$
- 130 IF EOF(1) THEN 160
- 140 PRINT A\$
- 150 GOTO 120
- 150 CLOSE #1
- 170 END
