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

MY SUMMER HIATUS OR WHAT I DO WHEN I DON'T ATTEND A SUPER SATURDAY PEETING!

When my sweet wife asked, "what are you going to do for me this vacation period ,this year*? I replied, 'anything you wish, my dear!'. That was when I started being educated on the "NONDERS of THE DZARK MOUNTAINS*. She mentioned *(1) Eureka Springs, Arkansas and (2) Branson, Missouri .

Now let me first tell you about Eureka Springs. We traveled by Motorhome, up Hwy 75 to Hwy 69 then at Meskogee, Oklahoma we turned off on a two lane road caled Hwy 62, which we slowly followed thru Favetteville to Eureka Springs. The road was fine until half way thru Oklahoma on Hwy 6%. Our map had not indicated curves nor large high grades in the road, but they were there. When your driving a 32 foot motorhome for the first time out, you don't need the seat belt to secure your backside to the driver's seat while negotiating mountain roads. It was 104 outside temperature, and the inside temperature. with windows open, was 101.4. We were traveling without generator to power the inside air conditioners, which failed at 100 miles out of Dallas. We were happy to finally see the KOA campgrounds out of Eureka Springs where we could connect up and cool down.

Eureka Springs, it is a very small town. It is located in the abuntains. In fact I think it's built on the side of the mountains in a small valley. Beautiful shops and senic old buildings. They tell you, Average summer temperature:89 high, 66 low. When we were there in July, it was 104 during the warmest part of the day, and the low was much higher than their stated average. Average wirter temperature: 5) high, 30 low. I have a strong feeling that this is a little bit high, A.titude 1,500 feet, City population 1989, county population 16,023, Non-resident fishing license: \$6.50 (3 day trip), \$14.50 (14-day trip). \$20.00 (Annual), Trout permit \$5.00, nearest Airport: Carroll, County, 10 miles east, 3100 feet, paved and lighted.

The biggest problem we found in this place was: (1) We were in a moter home without a drag car, so we were dependent upon local transportation. We stayed at a KOA which advertised Grayline and other transportation methods. Each of which were discontinued and not offered to any of the campgrounds in the area. They have a single can (Percedes) (A8 company. The cab company driver, (a lady) was the best I have had an opportunity to encounter in any small town. The town has a four (4) route TROLLEY SYSTEM that provides Scenic routes. Do not take the last tour of the day, you may end up at a destination other

than you planned. The Trolley Drivers end their last tour where ever they wish, not where the literature states it will end. Also, some of the Trolley drivers have personalities as good as a severly torn

pocket!

Now to the some positive things you can find in Eureka Springs: Antiques, Art Galleries, Banks, Grocery/Convenience Stores, Beauty Salon's, Lounges, Newspaper, Professional Services, Real Estate, Retail Stores, many many little unique shops. Tour Services, Water Activities. and Wedding Services. There is good fishing at Beyer Lake, near by Eureka Springs. The TV reception is not the greatest and the selection of channels is very sparce. There is a railroad for those that care to go on senic trian trips. For ENTERTAINMENT we attended several Country Music Shows. Ozark Mountain HOE-DCWN Theater (501 253 7725). Good entertainment. We also attended the Country music show of Pine Mountain Jamboree (501 253 9156) good show. "THE GREAT MASSION PLAY" is another experience everyone should see (501 253 9200). And of course Eureka Springs oldest attraction "BNYX CAVE PARK" where you can go down into a beautiful cave, if that is your thing. I only say that because I can't get my wife into a cave for the life of me. For these that do not have a recreational vehicle and care to visit this beautiful place, there are many Hotels, Notels, Bed and Breakfast Inns. Cabins, Cottages, and Tourist Homes.

Now for the lovdown on this place. We loved the town and the majority of the shopkeepers. The shopping selection was rather wide and attractive. The terrain was extremely hilly with very narrow and winding roads. Great shopping and great entertaining SHOWS. By the BUY it's fard to find a place to gas a rather large MOTORHOME in little EUREKA SPRINGS. If you go stay awhile and see them all!

NOW on to BRANSON, MISSOURI.

We drove Hwy? 26? From Eureka Springs to Branson. This is a 180 (2) LANE Road. CROOKEDER THAN A DOGS HIND LES! This part of the trip was worse than the previous mountainous road thatstarted in Oklahoma. It also took longer to drive, per mile. (I'll tell you how to get to these places in a much easier drive a little later.) The total miles to Branson from Dallas was 413 miles. If you are in a motorhome, you should try to get reservations at the "MUSICLAN) KOA" (417 334 0848). Why? Because it's within walking distance of 18 Shows, Eateries, factory Outlet Hall, and happenings.

Branson is a city with a population 2,500 people. It has 45,000 Theater sexts available. Among them, and may I say "All great and Professional Shows, for the ticket price of \$14.50 per person per show

are the following: Roy Clark's Celebrety Theater (417 334 7535) My nephew plays piano for the RDY CLARK ROAD BAND, look for him on the new Hee Haw Series in January 1992, Gilley's Theater (417 334 3210), Ozark Hountain Amp. (417 334 7272), Shoji abuchi Theater (He's a fiddler and a good one) (417 334 7469), Ray Steven's Theater (417 334 2422). Braschlers Theater (417 334 4363), Jubilee Theater (417 334 6400), Danny Davis and the Masville Brass (417 335 6888). Moe Bandy Theater (417 335 3176). The Baldnobber's Theater (417 334 4528), The Foggy River Boy's Theater (417 334 2536), The 36 Music Hall (417 334 2484), Bick Trent/Jeanne Pruett Dinner Thealer (417 335 5428), M-M-M-Hel Tillis Theater (417 335 6635), Christy line Theater (417 335 5111), Boxcar Willie's Theater (417 334 2639), Stars of the Dzarks, Jim Stafford Theater (417 335 2639), Love's Theater (417 334 0428), Ozark Morning Show Theater (417 335 2700). Also there is a theme park at the oitskirts of Branson called "SILVER DOLLAR CITY". It's made up of crafts and things that we all like.. Great for the children in all of us. On down the road a short distance past Silver Dollar City is the NOTEWORTHY DUTDOOR PLAY "SHEPHERD of the HILLS".

NOW TO THE IMPORTANT FART, THE TWO PLACES TO EAT IN ORDER OF QUALITY AND PRICE ARE: (1) THE WOODEN NICKEL. Located on Hwy 76 out pist the intersection of Hwy 265, on the right. A sit down and order place with a great salad bar. (2) Towny's located in the crotch of the intersection of Hwy's 65 and 165. This is a Buffet with a nice selection of good foot.

If you find that you need to rent a car, contact A-1 AUTO RENTALS (417 335 3932), \$25.00 a day plus mileage after 50 miles each day, and they will deliever.

The bad thing about Branson is the shopping. The shops as a whole are "JUNK" or "TOURIST TRAP" shops. Not a large selection of choice. The wonderful thing is the BANG FOR THE BUCK ON ENTERTAINMENT. In Las Vegas a stow cost is from \$65.00 to \$85.00 per person per show (with gambling). In Branson you can see a Las Vegas type show for \$14.50 per person per show (without gambling). But you do need to make reservations a couple of weeks before you plan to be in Branson. A big problem is the streets of Branson. With 2,500 people living in this place and 45,000 Theater seats and a large number of metels, the streets are in gridlock when the theaters let out. And YES they all let out at the same time. So, now you can see why I suggest that you stay where you have the ability to walk to your desired destination.

You can also enjoy other attractions and entertainment of the area. There is the Sammy Lee Pirate Cruse on the Lake Queen, Ozark Country Opry. Campbell's Ozark Jubilee, with the Blackwood Brothers.

There is a Texans at Bob-O-links Country Hoedown, a country variety show featuring 'THE TEXANS', Wilderness Safari, where you can go in your car and see the exotic Animals from all over the world. They've got'us from everywhere, with the exception of [EXAS. Now there's even one for the "RIPPER", STONE HILL WINERY, They give small samples and sell bottles of wine. This is a award winning winery. Yes, you can take the vinery tour, RIPPER! There is a place called "OZARK POTATO CHIP FACTORY" that is interesting. Harold Bell Wright Museum is located in Branson. Very close by Branson, and I do mean CLOSE, are LAKE TANECOMO, and TABLE ROCK LAKE, GOOD FISHIN'! The country side around Franson is beautiful. My Beautiful Child Bride (BCB) was extremely oleased with the senic drives we took in the beautiful country side. Oh yes! There is a WHITE WATER FAMILY PARK just out of Branson. And "WALTZING WATERS" am indoor water spectacular "LIQUID FIREWORKS* choreographed to the world's favorite musical scores. You can even take the Misses and kids and ride the DUCKS! Yes, your right, they have many old amphibious old World War II type of vehicles called "DUCKS". They have wheels on the bottom of the boat. They pick you up in the middle of town and take you right down and into the nearby lake. So you get a short tour of the like, BUT they don't scare any fish avay!

It's my suggestion that if you are going to see the shows and shop in both Eureka Springs and Branson, that FIRST you make reservations at least TWO WEEKS before you plan to be in eather or both of these towns. That you drive the good highway around the mountains to Branson. Make Branson the Hub of your travels and drive a good car thru the mountains for a long days visit to Eureka Springs, and then return before dark. Or spend the night in Eureka Springs, if necessary. It's a very long 40 to 50 mile trip, each way.

Now I told you I would tell you how to get to the Ozark's in an easy marner, while not driving thru the mountains. The way we came thru Eireka Springs, Arkansas to Branson, Missouri was a total of 413 miles. That's the rough way to go. We drove back to Dallas by going north to Springfield, Mo. on Hwy 65 (a new streight 2 lane highway with a third hill passing lane). Then, at Springfield, Mo., turning west or Interstate 44 (divided 4 lanes) to Hwy 69 in Oklahoma. Then south on Hwy 69 (4 lane divided) to Hwy 75 (divided 4 lane) and on into Dallas. This was a streight less hilly route and the total miles traveled in returning to Dallas was 420 miles. A difference of just 7 miles, but a much easier and faster drive.

No matter what motivates you go see the DIARKS.....Or 60 SOMEHHEFE! And when you come back, IF YOU ENJOY THE TRIP, let us of the club know about it. In fact if you didn't enjoy it, let us know about it! THEN COME BACK TO THE CLUB GATHERINGS, SECAJSE WE MISS YOU!



My first order of business will be to resume the publication of Reflections/Asgard News - publishing had been suspended last Fall. Our marksting efforts should improve, with more attention paid to getting catalogs out and users more quickly updated on new developments. I will have more time to keep up with all of the paperwork - from getting checks out quicker to authors and creditors to informing customers of new andates.

The additional time will also allow me to concentrate more on new product development. Asgard has over a dozen software items sitting on the shelf, only lacking documentation, time and attention to turn them into marketable products. I will also have time to be of much greater assistance to authors developing software for publishing through Asgard. Pinally, I've been doing much more programming lately myself, and I hope to try my hand at a few projects — the reason I started Asgard in the first place was to publish my own work.

All customer service will still be handled by me directly and I will remain Asgard's spokesman. Other then that, I expect sothing less then a complete transformation of what has become one of the largest TI software companies. Many people bought and continue to own TI-99/4A's because of the level of service that TI offered and still offers. I hope within a few months people will come to expect the same service from Asgard as well. Thank you for your patience and support over the years, and I tope we have mary more ahead of us.
