Again, CONGRATULATIONS to STEVEN THOMASON of Haslet, TX. SEE YOU SOON.


FAIRWARE, SHAREWARE AND FREEWARE

These terms are not fully understood by everyone. These terms refer to software that is NOT Public Domain. Any Computer software that is "released to the Public Domain" is the only software that should be deemed free to users. Fairware, Shareware, or Freeware are all similar terms that mean the user is obligated to send the authors a contribution. Inasmuch as very few authors ask for much in the way of a donation, the user should take this obligation seriously. If you don't use the product, that is another matter. The authors often ask you to pass it on, gratis, if you aren't using it. It is the Ultimate User that owes the author something. TI-99/4A user groups are often complimented for what nice people belong to the group. But if one reads what some of the authors say, they get VERY LITTLE in the way of royalties or donations from users. It is not known how many users DO NOT PAY the authors, nor how many users fail to follow the author's request (if they do not use it) that they pass the program along to some one else who can use it. Procrastinating in sending the author his due, rather than intentional avoidance, is probably the main reason more users do not send in their money. I shought it worth mentioning this topic so that others who might possibly also be confused with these terms Fairware Shareware, and Freeware, might be updated. If Santa Claus was very good to you this past Christmas, pethaps you can reach DEEP into your pockets and send the authors what you owe. Where would we, that is the TI WORLD be if we did not have these many, many hardworking authors? The only way they know you is if they receive a THANK YOU (with their requested fee)!

We need these people to stay ALIVE in the TI-99/4A WORLD. So won't you give today for these very fine programs. THANK YOU.
