TRANSPORTATION:

It turns out that the difference between success and failure is found on the business side of the equation rather than the programing side. These concepts will work regardless of the computer you're programing for, so I hope the TI community will take advantage of this information. For those who can't make it, all sessions are taped and I will follow up this in another issue to report on what happened and how to get tapes and abstracts.



Those of us who have placed messages or full fledged works of prose onto Free-net or any BBS, with the TELCO line editor or the editor provided by the BBS has experienced the ultimate pain in the (you know what). Keep in mind that the line editor is just that, (could never) be a complete word processor by any stretch of the imagination.

So what do you do when you want to put a message longer than two or three lines, on the BBS? You up-load the pre-recorded text file from a disk drive. Therefore you can create a finished text, spell checked and all, save it to disk and finally up-load it from the disk to the BBS. All without the headache of fumbling with a line editor.

But how is this miracles of miracles accomplished? Well, "rather simply" is a phrase that comes to mind, and what follows is how it can be done.

First, you must configure the FILE TRANSPER SET-UP routine in TELCO. Choose the "Setup options" from TELCO's main menu. Then choose "File transfer setup" from that menu, and set the file transfer defaults. The file transfer defaults that work well for ME are as follows:

A)Abort dewnloads : Discard B)Default error check : CRC C)Echo locally : 011 D)Blank lines . 011 E)Character pacing : 000 F)Line pacing : 010 G)Pace character : 000 H)Stripleading space : 011 I)Line by line feed : 011 J)Send at end of line : CR K)CR translation : Strip L)LF translation : Strip

(Press <FCTN/9> and "save (C)hanges")

Once the file transfer defaults are set and saved, you can up-load any text file with the greatest of ease, using the following five simple steps. (See, I do use the word "simple".)

- 1. Whether you are contributing an article or an answer to a BBS or writing to somebody by E-mail, and are cued, on the creen, to enter your file: just press <FCTN/s>.
 - 2. Choose ASCII option by pressing (ENTER).
- 3. Type the full disk.filename into the filename block (ie., DSKn.FILENAME), and press <ENTER>.
- 4. Your text file will then be quickly up-leaded and you can monitor the progress by the up-leaded line numbers shewn at

the bottom of the screen.

After which, a "Transfer Complete-Press a Key" message is 🔑 shown. So - Press & key.

5. The very last line of your text file will be shown at the bottom of the screen, and the cursor will appear on the next blank line. To signal End-of-File:

Type in the familar "###" and press <ENTER>.

with TELCO. That's all there is to up-loading text files It's quick and it's SIMPLE. And best of all, NO MORE STRUGGLING WITH A LINE EDITOR!!!!

TELCO DO THE CALLING

It goes without saying that TELCO is one super piece of software for the TI-99/4A. This program enables the Tier to communicate with the outside world. And not only can we talk to fellow Tiers. but we are able, thanks to TELCO, to communicate · with any and all systems with the greatest of ease!

Recently, I decided to have TELCO perform another service me. This time I use TELCO to call realtives, friends and businesses for me. This allows me to dial frequently used phone numbers that I can't remember and don't want to look up every

The method is simple. I just load TELCO and choose (A)uto dialer form the main menu. I then press <M> and select the phone line number I want to add or edit. I type in the name and phone number, and leave the modem defaults alone. (Remember to press <FCTN \$> to rturn to the Main Menu and choose (S)etup optins and to save (C)hanges.)

From then on, all I have to de is load TELCO, choose (A) uto dialer, PICK UP THE PHONE and enter the phone line number of the person I want to call . All I have to remember is to press <FCTN 4> when the FIRST ring is sounded. This will isolate me from TELCO and the modem, and I will be able to cintinue my phone call as I usually would. The only difference between manually dialing the phone and letting TELCO do the calling. is that I DON'T HAVE TO LOOK UP PHONE NUMBERS ANYMORE!

(You might want to stick "1170," in front of the phone numbers that you don't want "Call Waiting" to interrupt.)

I saw Jack at Fest West and thanked him for the package he'd sent. "Don't use the DM1000 I sent you, it's got a bug in it! Let me give you a new one!" And he autographed it for me. Ain't I (contraction for 'Am I not') proud!

Let me tell you, this version is the most beautiful disk and file manager ever did I see. And the docs? B.J. did well: The documentation is very clear and easy to follow.

What makes v6.1 different from 5.0? Major modifications include:

- Consolidation of the Disk and File Utility Menus into one Main Menu.
- 2) (T)ype or (P)rint in the CMD column of File Utilities catalog displays a DV/DF80 file to the screen or print it out.
- 3) Disk initialization (formatting) and copying are speeded up.
- 4) Defaults for disk formatting, printer configuration (device and codes), and foreground and background colors may be saved into the program.
 - 5) Choice of drives for saving configure defaults.
- 6) Works with Myarc HFDC on TI and on Geneve with Ben Hatheway's ROMPAGE loaded.

Print out the documentation with TI-Writer or the Print File Option of BOOT!, MENU, or DM1000 itself. A Quick Reference Guide is included in the documentation.

The following key presses are active in File Utilities:

FCTN 1 Delete a character

FCTN 2 Insert a character

FCTN 3 Configure List Device (printer or DSKn.filename)

FCTN 4 Halt disk drive I/O operation

FCTN 5 Return to DM1000 main menu.

FCTN 6 Request "EXECUTE COMMANDS Y/N" prompt

FCTN 7 Print Catalog to List Device

FCTN 8 Re-enter Drive #

FCTN 9 Return to DM1000 main menu

FCTN - Exit Disk Manager 1000

FCTN E Move cursor up one field

FCTN X Move cursor down one field

FCTN S Move cursor left one character or back one field

FCTN D Move cursor right one character or ahead one field

CTRL E Move cursor back one page

CTRL X Move cursor ahead one page

CTRL C Copy all files

CTRL D Delete all files

CTRL N Perform No Action on any files

CTRL P Protect All Files

CTRL U Unprotect All Files

Individual files may be marked for Copy, Delete, Move, Protect, or Unprotect and then press FCTN 6 to proceed. T or P must be done by themselves.

When DM1000 copies a disk you have a choice of Bitmap (copying only the sectors that are used) or Sector copying all the disk sectors.

If you (D)elete a file then wish you hadn't, Undelete will ask you for the disk drive number and the filename and it will reconstruct the link between the directory and the file so you have your file back.

Unprotect is only for Extended BASIC programs and if it is used on other files, they may be unusable.

Error Messages are in friendly English, no code numbers. This program is USER FRIENDLY.

To put DM1000 on your BOOT! or Horizon Ram Disk you only need MGR1 and MGR2. For the DOM 1/89 BOOT!, just copy these two files over the ones you have and delete MGR3. In MENU, delete files MG and MH and copy MGR1 and MGR2, then rename them MG and MH.

This program is our Utility of the Month and I will be demonstrating it at the meeting for you. I will have a few printouts available for those who have disk drives but no printer yet.
