Needless to say, Dad spent many more hours at the keyboard than the first born did. Even so the TI helped with the

important early learning stages of letter and number recognition, shapes and colours. That "Early Learning Fun" module got a terrific workout in those days. 




A meeting will be held on Wednesday, January 19, at 7:30 P.M. to discuss the formation of a TI 99/4A users group in the Peterborough area.


I have received a "Start-Up-Kit" from T.I. which helps organize the preliminary meetings and subsequent constitution.
