The May issue of the TI Home Computer Newsletter had a program statement on page 5 of:

100 ON X+(Y/5) GOTO ...

That statement can be improved by eliminating the parentheses, because they are unnecessary. The improved statement is:

100 ON X+Y/5 GOTO ...

This is a good example of the "My Sally" Aunt rule. Division Multiplication and are before Addition and performed Subtraction. See rules for mathematical hierarchy, page II-13 in the User's Reference Guide.

The improved statement will execute 13% faster than the original statement

and also saves two bytes.

So you see, it does make a great deal of difference how a program is coded!

The September issue of the TI Home Computer Newsletter had an article on page 5, "Tips for Using Variables". Unfortunately, the article contained a few ambiguities and errors. So, in the interest of accuracy (which, after all, is the name of the game in computer programming), I offer the following clarifications.

"A variable can be up to 15 characters long." --- I think what was meant is, "A variable name can be up to 15 characters long." (It can also be 15 characters long.) Actually, a string variable can be up to (and including)

255 characters long.

"The name cannot contain a space (character 32), or any reserved word."
--- Actually, there are 52 other characters that cannot be used in a variable name either. See page II-11. (Note that lower-case letters cannot be used, because TI BASIC changes them back to upper-case letters.) Furthermore, a variable name can contain a reserved word. See page II-16.

The article gave a program statement as, "PRINCIPLE*RATE=INTEREST". Of course, that simply will not work. It should be, "INTEREST=PRINCIPLE*RATE".


